Call Meeting to Order / Meeting Norms / Introductions / Acknowledgements - Ryan Flynn

Roy Cloud Discovery Series - Session 1 : Looking Forward to Grades 3 - 5 - Belinda Mendez, Julie Kraus, and Nick Tsivikas

- Each teacher briefly discussed the skills the students will learn in each grade, some of the highlights of each grade, Math, Social Studies, and Science
- Alex thanked all of the teachers for taking the time to present tonight
- Questions:
 - Did 3rd grade have a different test today? She will email her question to the PTO box so someone can follow up on it
 - Is Outdoor Ed in the fall? Normally it's in October but sometimes in February.
 Hopefully we will be able to continue it next year.
 - Will they be teaching one subject based on their strength when we go back to in person school? We started to look into it prior to Covid, but haven't found a way that it could work due to multiple issues.
 - What is each grades biggest challenge? All grades said that children don't trust themselves to make mistakes and they need to be ok with it. They need to know that we are a family and support each other. Also there isn't enough time to explore things that the kids are passionate about all the time.
 - How do you develop executive functioning skills to be more independent? We use a
 planner in 5th grade to teach how to be organized when studying. There is also class
 switching to get them ready for middle school. In 4th grade, there are long term
 projects and they are responsible to write down homework assignments. In 3rd grade
 there is a lot of modeling responsibility and planning
 - Do you feel there is enough SEL support right now? They have had a ton of training and support. It's now part of their everyday class time. The principle, vice principle and Ms. Rivoli are very helpful and provide support
 - Do they get hands on Science in 4th and 5th? Outdoor Ed is a big hands on science experience for 5th grade. They also have science for scientists. They try to get it in twice a week. 3rd grade has mealworms in the class. All do garden and build circuits.
